The Spiral of Love

It has been observed that our lives, in the context of Jewish time, are like spirals. We continue to cycle



back through the same events, year after year, all the while moving upward: Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, festivals, Shabbat, punctuated by marriages and births and deaths and benei mitzvah, joy and grieving and celebration and solemnity. And each time we come back to these holy moments, we have grown older and wiser; we have more tools in our spiritual sheds and better lenses through which to see the world. The siddur / prayer book used on High Holidays and festivals is called a mahzor, literally, a "cycle."

My guess is that you probably have not yet thought about entering the new Jewish year of 5779. After all, we still have a few more months of 5778 to enjoy. But I have been thinking about it for quite some time, and I can tell you that the theme for this High Holiday cycle will be Ahavah / Love: love of self, love of family, love of community, love of the world. Maybe you have noticed that the world could use a bit more love, and that starts with loving ourselves, and building on that love as we spiral upwards and outwards.

"Ahavah rabbah ahavtanu," we chant every morning: "With great love, You have loved us." However we understand God, however we access the Divine idea, the essential statement of God's relationship with us is that God demonstrated love for humans, all humans, by giving us Torah. In acting on Torah, in studying and interpreting and fulfilling and questioning and wrestling with Torah, we are increasing the love in this world.

It's not too early to prepare for 5779, and I'm

not talking about cooking brisket for your Rosh Hashanah lunch. Take a moment to think about the state of the world today, and how you might be able to increase the love, even a tiny amount. What are the things you can do right now to make yourself, your community, your world more loved? We'll discuss this further as the next turn in the spiral comes around. Enjoy the summer!

With the major festivals behind us one might think that the summer is a quiet time at the Shul with little happening beyond our



Conservative Community Tish'ah BeAv service. In reality, there's hard work underway, both in regard to planning for Fall religious services, and in thinking about the future direction of Beth Shalom. Our Religious Services Committee, along with our professionals, are now engaged in planning for the High Holidays as they do every year at this time.

But beyond this important but recurring task, we are also involved in rigorous thinking about our future. This is an exciting time in the history of Congregation Beth Shalom as we move forward beyond our 100th year. In the months ahead we will be taking an ambitious and realistic look at where we have been and where we are going as a congregation with guidance from United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism. With the help of a transformation specialist who has worked with many synagogues; we will create a new strategic plan over the next year.

The last strategic plan was developed in 2008 with much devotion and a very diligent effort from many of our Shul members. As we looked at the plan, we realized that many of the suggested goals have been accomplished but in other areas we are still progressing or have not been able to attempt the recommendations. In the leadership section, we have successfully modified the Board of Trustees to be more effective. Another example of our progress in the leadership area is Rabbi Adelson's work to develop young leadership with help from USCJ programming. Our fiduciary duty to the congregation has been to reduce the deficit and we are continuing to do so. In the area of fundraising, we have begun to develop long-term goals established through our Centennial efforts, which will be an on-going

challenge for us because of necessary building repairs. The Derekh Program has had a successful year with the engagement of many young and older families in our community, collaborating with other institutions and providing needed adult programming. Over the last two years, our USY has become an award winning organization with increased engagement with teens in our area. JJEP and our Preschool have both had successful school years with increased enrollment.

Beth Shalom is in a very different place now than ten years ago. We now have strong congregational support and continuously increasing membership. We are fortunate to have an excellent staff and are continuing to work toward meeting the needs of our congregants on many levels. So it is only fitting that now is the time to ponder our future and begin to implement a new plan to enhance our Shul community. We continue to need you—to volunteer, to work together, to share your strengths and common goals to help us advance Beth Shalom's mission.

Sustainability!

Sustainability is easy to define: ensure that our revenues can balance our expenses, every year, year after year.



For a nonprofit, a balanced budget is the goal and the requirement. For four straight years, the budgeted deficit has shrunk and, in reality, we were able to generate net revenue last year. That was not surprising, since we celebrated our centennial year with a major fundraising effort. We know that, although we have nearly balanced our budget for this fiscal year, we are not close to being sustainable. Without an exceptional fundraising effort, our expenses exceed our revenues. We don't celebrate our Centennial every year, but we must continue to raise funds.

Beth Shalom has been reinvigorated to be the thriving center of Judaism for Pittsburgh. 35 new members last year and 29 the year before. Numerous new courses, concerts, and celebrations. An attitude of inclusion and exploration. Upgraded facilities and efficient administrative policies. How can we sustain the momentum?

There are only two choices for financial sustainability: reduce expenses or increase revenues. We can reduce expenses, but by doing so we change who we are and what our vision is. The other choice is to increase revenues. We have opportunities to market our building, increase donations, and increase dues. We can sustain who we are if you are willing to support Beth Shalom. You have some decisions to make and you need a planning process to help you make those decisions.

Planning for sustainability requires getting the information about you and our opportunities. The

Strategic Planning process which we've started, with the help of the USCJ, should give you the tools to determine just what you want Beth Shalom to be and what the opportunities are to get us there.

Sustainability comes down to the individual. Be part of the process, define what you want Beth Shalom to be, and then step up with your knowledge, time, and money.



Spring and Summer are in the air and I look back on a wonderful year for Sisterhood. We began with the successful High Holiday challah sale and later in the month,




