Torah with the Night Owls

The best night of the year in Squirrel Hill is that of the 6th of Sivan, the first night of Shavu'ot, when the hardy souls who love digging into our traditional texts learn all night long at the JCC and around the neighborhood, including at Beth Shalom. And since this year will be in person once again after two years of online learning (which is certainly better than no learning, but everything is better in person!), I expect that this year's *Tikkun Leil Shavu'ot* will be especially meaningful.

What is it that drives some of us to stay up all night learning Torah on Shavu'ot? What is it about our ancient texts that keeps drawing us back to them? Why are there more people engaged in *Daf Yomi*, learning one page of Talmud per day, than ever before? The Judaism of my youth - regular Shabbat attendance at synagogue, USY and Camp Ramah, family meals for Shabbat and Yom Tov - did not necessarily highlight learning rabbinic text. Talmud was for my rabbi and his colleagues and maybe some of the old guys who used to study together after minyan on Sunday mornings.

But there are so many new ways to learn today: podcasts and Sefaria and videos and daily emails and so forth. The veil of ancient obscurity provided by rabbinic Aramaic patois, with its curious grammar and insider jargon, has been lifted, revealing the magical contents of the Jewish bookshelf. Widespread access and good teachers who are willing to bring inspiring texts to life have made the democratization of Jewish text, a project begun by Rashi in the 11th century CE, nearly complete. It is so easy today to fulfill the weightiest mitzvah of the 613: getting busy with words of Torah.

So come and learn with the night owls on Saturday night, June 4th. Come and find out why Torah continues to appeal, how to unlock the secrets of ancient texts, what the fuss is all about. Join us as we learn into the wee hours, and I promise you that your time will be better spent than just about anything else you could possibly be doing at that time. See you there!

A Message from Our President

It has now been one year since the beginning of my presidency of Beth Shalom. It has been a challenging and incredibly fulfilling year with more challenges ahead for the coming year. We have weathered a number of storms such as dealing with a new strain of COVID and when and how to best bring congregants back to shul, challenging financial issues, unexpected repairs to our building, searching for an additional clergy to partner with Rabbi Adelson, maintaining adequate staffing, finding a new IT system and many other issues. Despite these very difficult tests with which we were faced, we found ways to successfully get through them. This was due to the strength of our spiritual leader Rabbi Seth Adelson (we never missed a service throughout the pandemic), our staff led by Executive Director Robert Gleiberman, and the efforts of our COVID Task Force which was guided by some of the most able, knowledgeable and caring doctors and public health experts in the area. In addition, our successes can also be attributed to our Executive Committee and Board of Trustees who regularly went above and beyond to make sure Beth Shalom succeeded and made meaningful progress implementing our Strategic Plan. Lastly but certainly not least, I want to send a thank you to our volunteers who somehow always showed up or made contributions when they were needed. Many thanks and Yasher Koach to all. Our Congregation's successes clearly demonstrated why we are such a strong and vibrant community. We still have many daunting challenges ahead. We will face these head on. With the continued support, generosity and skills of our membership and staff, I am very confident we will continue to make our shul a better and more welcoming place. Let's make Beth Shalom feel like home!

While I have delineated some of the tests we faced over the past year above, we had a long list of successes and good things to be happy about as well.

- We have hired Rabbi Mark Goodman as Associate Rabbi, to partner with Rabbi Adelson. This will free up Rabbi Adelson to do some of those things he has not had time for in the past and will also be transferring some of his current duties to Rabbi Goodman. Rabbi Goodman will also be in charge of Youth Tefillah and teach some Derekh classes.
- We are proud of our decision to offer health benefits to all of our employees, as well as increasing wages of our hourly wage earners. We hope this will reduce the amount of turnover and potentially attract new employees. These are parts of our Strategic Plan that were long overdue.
- Our ELC enrollment is beginning to return toward pre-pandemic levels significantly helping our budget.
- We are installing four new air conditioners on the synagogue roof to replace those that are well past their useful life.
- The cornice on the outside of the sanctuary is being replaced which will prevent broken sections from falling down thereby eliminating potential accidents.
- We now have a tent for outdoor activities and services in warmer weather.
- There is a new IT system in place making us much more efficient and effective.
- We have been awarded several large grants to help with ELC operations and are actively applying for others to potentially help our infrastructure needs. Thanks to our Development Director, Rabbi Andy Shugerman and Treasurer Fred Newman for these.
- We are painting the ballroom and have replaced the curtain on the stage making it more desirable for rental opportunities.
- Our cemetery is in good shape with several capital projects being slotted for the coming year.
- We have completed leadership training for our Board of Trustees through the USCJ and have streamlined our meetings to make them more effective.

A Message from our Development Director

One of the fun challenges of my still-new role at Beth Shalom is that I often need to write about one aspect or another of our property for a potential funder despite my having only moved here a year ago. I call that a “fun challenge” because I am curious about so much of the history of our synagogue and how that history informs a sense both of what we are today and where we are headed in the future.

Among the almost half-million dollars in grant awards that I have managed in various ways during my inaugural year at Beth Shalom, I am particularly proud of the successful application I submitted on behalf of our Development Committee last winter to the Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation (PHLF), whose sign one can see below the scaffolding they helped to finance for our Sanctuary cornice repairs.

Here is how our team explained the need for those repairs to folks who likely have never visited Beth Shalom or even passed by the intersection of Beacon Street and Shady Avenue:

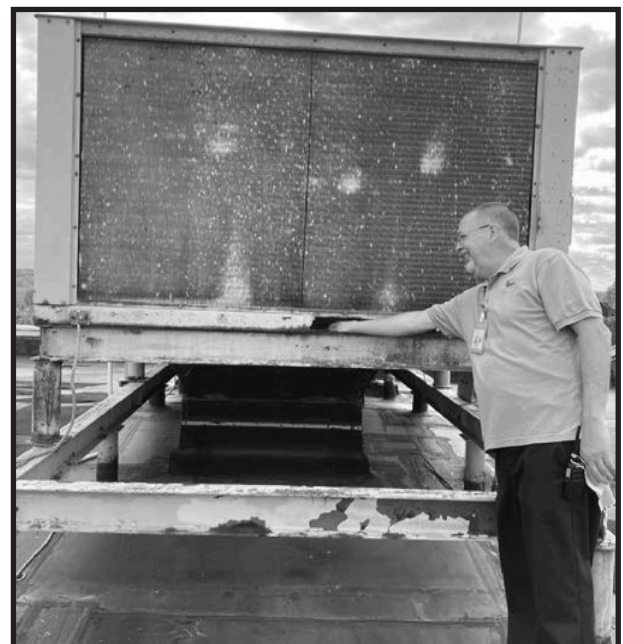
“Deterioration at the cornice level is a safety hazard to pedestrian traffic and also threatens the structural integrity of the sanctuary building. Pieces of the southern façade have been falling down for years. As a result of this safety hazard, the street entrance to the sanctuary was long ago closed. More recently, falling cornice pieces forced the closure of our Shady Avenue sidewalk adjacent educational garden, displacing La Escuelita’s activities and requiring construction of a temporary garden in a section of our parking lot instead. Water ingress from the disintegrating façade and portico is also damaging the main sanctuary building, and our next major project will involve repairing and/or replacing much of the sanctuary roof.”

The previous paragraph exemplifies what made our grant application successful. We made a clear case not just for the needs of our sanctuary building and its repairs, but its disrepair has been disruptive for our community partners and our neighbors. In fact, both New Light Congregation and La Escuelita wrote to PHLF with enthusiastic support for our funding request and demonstrated how essential Beth Shalom is to the Squirrel Hill community beyond our congregation alone.

Every Friday at Shabbat BaBoker, Rabbi Adelson leads our students and educators in *Hine Ma Tov* - focusing us on the joy that comes from being together. This ELC School Year has been a testament to "how good it is to be together."

We began the year welcoming back families and teachers who had taken the 2020-2021 year off due to COVID concerns. Morah Elana and Morah Katie returned to lead our Older Threes and Older Toddler classes. Morah Diane came back to assist in our PreK. Morah Debbey, our Music Specialist, and Morah Elaine, our Science Specialist, returned in person after teaching our students via zoom last year. The sounds of joyous song and intellectual curiosity abound as the children greet and engage with them each week in their classrooms.

Parents re-entered the building, as we resumed drop off and pick up at the classrooms, allowing them to see their children, teachers and one another within the learning environment. Our older age groups are able to spend a bit of time together during gross motor time in the gym.

The playground may once again be used by two to three classes at a time. It is wonderful to see the children as they greet their siblings, friends, and teachers from other classes, no longer separated for the full eight-hour day from one another.

Shabbat BaBoker required virtual attendance via zoom, with only one class in person with the Rabbi at the start of the year. This spring, with the decrease in COVID numbers, all of our two-year-olds and up are able to come together in the sanctuary each Friday! Grandparents and Special Friends Shabbat welcomed PreK guests in person and all others via zoom, allowing all to share the joy of being together.

Our PTO has done an amazing job this year, as they established a Teacher Appreciation cart, offering snacks and drinks for our teachers. They planned our Hanukkah and Purim parties, recruiting volunteers and setting up games and activities for each class to enjoy with their parents in the ballroom. They coordinated Passover Playdates in the gym and are planning a Parent's Night Out and School Picnic for our ELC Families.

We are busily preparing for Summer Camp and the 2022-2023 School Year which promises to bring more togetherness and joy. More occasions to happily sing "*Hine Ma Tov*"!

Lydia Kukoff, a pioneer in welcoming and educating conversion students, can be credited with the maxim that every Jew is a Jew by choice. The meaning, in case you haven't heard it, is that given nothing forcing Jews to remain connected, each one of us ultimately chooses to stay connected. This reality leads us to wonder, what exactly is it about Judaism that motivates us to choose to keep it in our lives? That is the million-dollar question.

The answer isn't guilt, that's for sure so if you've tried that on your children or grandchildren, you will get a positive response once or twice and then diminishing returns, to put it nicely. Don't bother with guilt.

It isn't tradition. Doing something just because it's been done doesn't work either. Oh, you can force family to maintain a tradition to mollify some other family member but when that person is gone, so is the tradition.

Bottom line, you can't make Jews be Jewish. But perhaps we can make Jews want to be Jewish. I've been thinking a lot about how to make Judaism personal. Well, more personal than we might have articulated in past religious schools.

Judaism is a great communal endeavor. It relies on the corporate body that is the Jewish people. But each individual member of the Jewish people has to feel something personal to remain in that community. For example, I've been thinking about reframing prayer as having "secret meanings" that each J-JEP student can be empowered to tease out in a way that speaks to the individual. Prayer itself might be less a communal experience of liturgy recitation and more a quiet moment of reflection on the themes we tease out. And it is a chance to have a spiritual moment if we can reframe

prayers as speaking to eternal and, therefore, contemporary concerns. I'm not talking just about the meaning of the prayers. I'm talking about the usefulness of the prayers and the usefulness of *tefillot* in general. For those of you accustomed to going to Shabbat services, ask yourself why you do this. Is there anything you find useful about the experience? Is there something the experience does for you? No doubt you would say yes and years of adult experience has taught you that it feels good and meaningful. But can you articulate it? (Seriously, let me know.)

When working with children, we don't have years for them to grow into the experience. We have to help them discover how prayer can bring added value to their lives right now. Right now! We don't have years for them to enjoy the regularity of tradition. We have to show them how it is meaningful and fun right now.

And that is what I will be planning over my summer vacation. I will be working with some rabbis and cantors in the community as we struggle to identify direct, personal, useful aspects of tefillah and our traditions and then figure out how to teach that to the children so they can experience meaning and uplift of their Jewish heritage. I also will be teaching similar things to parents throughout the year so that they can keep up with their kids. I've already begun that process!

If you have any thoughts, ideas, musings, I would love to hear them. Let me know what worked and what didn't work when you were in religious school. And let me know what connects you to your heritage. I would love to know why you continue to choose Judaism.

Kenny: I didn't really intend to be a lawyer. I wanted to be a baseball player. But someone told me I had to know how to hit and to field, so that ended the dream.
