Robert J. Garvin has been a member of Beth Shalom since his parents joined the Congregation in 1968. From there, Bob attended Hebrew and Sunday School along with Saturday morning Jr. Congregation services. He celebrated his Bar Mitzvah and Confirmation at the shul. He is a proud member of the prestigious Allderdice class of 1976 and a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh and Duquesne University School of Law. Over the course of the last 30 years, he has been a member of the Beth Shalom Board of Trustees and has served on the Constitutional and Bylaws Committee. He has been a member or the chair of the Nominating Committee on three occasions. He also chaired a Committee that was responsible for negotiating Rabbi Adelson's second contract with the Congregation. Pittsburgh Jewish Chronicle Volunteer of the Year Award Joseph Jolson

Joseph Jolson moved to Pittsburgh in 1992, with his wife, (Sabina), son, (Michael), and daughter, (Ilana). Michael lives in Squirrel Hill with his wife, (Shoshanna), and their children (Ariel, Meital, and Gavriel). They are regular attendees at CBS. Ilana lives in Rockville with her husband (Daniel), and their children (Jordan and Reyna). They are regular attendees at B'nai Israel. Recently, Barbara and Philip Barnett, Shoshanna's parents, moved to Pittsburgh and quickly integrated into CBS's family and the local Jewish community.

After receiving his Ph.D. in Analytical Chemistry, Joe led teams for the Mine Safety Appliances Company (MSA) in Baltimore that developed implantable batteries and gas detection equipment. One morning, he was surprised to find that a pacemaker with a battery designed by one of his teams was implanted in his mother-in-law's chest.



For eight years, after MSA's Baltimore unit was merged into the Instrument Division, he commuted from Squirrel Hill to Cranberry Township. In 2000, he became technical director of the CSE Corporation in Monroeville. The rescue of nine coal miners trapped underground at the Quecreek cave was accelerated after gas detection equipment designed by another team he led indicated that the air in the shaft they were trapped in was breathable. In 2005, Joe started Custom Client Solutions. In this capacity, he helped plaintiffs injured by defective products. He enjoys saying that he started the great resignation by retiring in March of 2019.

For years, Joe was active in the American Chemical Society (ACS), the ACS - Pittsburgh Section, and the Society for Analytical Chemists of Pittsburgh. He was a member of the ACS's board of directors, an officer of the ACS - Pittsburgh Section, an ACS career counselor, and the coordinator of the Job Searching Workshop for Chemical Professionals. At professional society meetings, chemists repeatedly thanked him for providing information that helped them land their dream job.

Joe has attended CBS's Saturday morning services and annual meetings since moving to Pittsburgh. He has been a continuous member of CBS's board of trustees since 2013 and holds the position of VP of Operations. In this role, he is responsible for upgrades to CBS's facility and reduction in its carbon footprint. He spearheaded the cornice replacement project that eliminated the safety hazard that surrounded the sanctuary building. He serves on the finance committee, house committee, budget subcommittee, and investment subcommittee. He was the driving force behind CBS's Journey of the Spirit trip to Israel.
