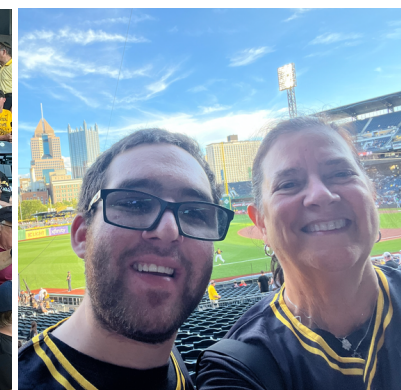

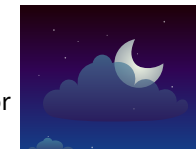


Community Selihot
